# NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT GRANTS

## DEWEY CITY

### HOME IMPROVEMENT GRANT

The Individual Home Improvement grant is a neighborhood revitalization program that encourages groups of neighbors (three or more) to collaborate on exterior improvements to their properties in order to build confidence in their neighborhood and inspire others to reinvest.

- Up to \$7,500 grant for non-cosmetic home improvements. Priority is given to health and safety improvements.
- Applicants must reside in the Dewey City neighborhood and apply as a group of at least three neighbors within visual distance. Each applicant must submit their own application for requested funds. (up to \$7,500 each).
- Requires demonstrated neighborhood activity participation, sweat equity, or matching support.
- Funds to be paid directly to contractors. Neighborhood-based contractors are given preferred vendor status.

### NEIGHBORHOOD ACTIVITIES GRANT

Neighborhood Activities Grant offers up to \$5,000 grant for temporary or pilot "place-making" activities, public art, educational programs, public service projects, or other activities that bring people together within a focus neighborhood.

- Involve five or more neighborhood residents (may include residential or commercial residents) and
- Led by neighborhood-based church, non-profit, civic groups/associations (including fraternities or sororities), or informal resident groups.
- Public spaces require approval from City of Thomasville.
- Can not be given for religious or political programs or lobbying efforts.

### COMMERCIAL FACADE GRANT

The Commercial Facade Grant offers up to \$10,000 as a matching grant for exterior commercial facade improvements. Eligible projects include signage installation, painting and repairing, landscaping, door and window repair, and more.

- Project applicant must be the owner of a properly zoned commercial property within the Traditional Neighborhoods URA.
- Grant to be approved with cost estimate and paid to business owner with invoice for work completed.
